PARIS AIR SHOW SHOWS LATEST RESEARCH AND INDUSTRY INNOVATIONS



For over 100 years, the Paris Air Show has been the world's leading aerospace event – and this year, another exciting Expert Talk took place at the Vienna University of Technology stand.

Following the AACII Congress and the third expert talk at TU Wien, this event once again welcomed leading figures from research and industry:

The keynote speaker for research, Prof. Dr.

Michael Weigand, presented the latest research advances at the stand. Dr. Peter Glöckner, CEO of Schaeffler Aerospace, gave an overview of outstanding contributions to aircraft sustainability. Tim Sowa, CEO of Aerospace Transmission Technologies, a joint venture between Rolls-Royce and Liebherr Aerospace, offered exciting insights into the context of the Rolls-Royce Ultrafan programme.

The event was opened by Ulrike Trapp, AACII – Aviation Aerospace Congress Interdisciplinary International emphasising the importance of cooperation between science and industry.

AACII New generation hosted at the Museum of Future Nuremberg



The New Generation Expert Talk was opened with a welcome address by Norbert Dünkel, Member of the Bavarian Parliament and member of the Bavarian Parliament's Education Committee. He described the dialogue between science and practice as an important stimulus, as Bavaria is known as the number one state for education. This is particularly significant in the current climate of transformation.

Aron Schoepf explained the concept of the Deutsches Museum in Nuremberg, which exhibits futureoriented technologies. Almost half a million visitors have shown interest since it opened. The Expert Talk



followed the AACII Aerospace Congress, where

New Generation was very well received as a focus. In spring, 300 participants from 20 countries also experienced the New Generation Forum on stage in Nuremberg, as well as great projects in the exhibition with




Interior Minister Joachim Herrmann. Ulrike Trapp from AACII announced the speakers in the packed lecture hall.

Everyone was fascinated by the new educational robot PIB from Isento, developed by Dr Jurgen Baier, Dr Shota Okojava and Thomas Graebe.

Dr Axel Müller from OHB presented the unique satellite production with its projects, drawing heavily on his inspiration from his

education at Stanford University: "We face major challenges, particularly in space travel. These range from security, climate change monitoring and modelling to reliable global data transfer. In addition, the companies involved are facing a growing demand for skilled workers coupled with a decline in the number of students in strategically important STEM subjects. The exchange at the very fitting Museum of the Future in Nuremberg has initiated

a dialogue between initiatives at schools, universities, various small

and large companies, and at the political level. It has become clear that approaches are being pursued everywhere that will need to be coordinated in the future."



Schaeffler Aerospace projects with a focus on sustainability was the topic addressed by Adrian Popp, winner of the AACII New Generation Award.

The cyber company Lantech has exciting prospects, as presented by CEO Günter Meixner, who raised awareness of the new CRA regulations in the

field of cyber security in industry and the successful integration of IEC62443-4-2 into Lantech switch products.



Prof Siegfried Balleis, head of the New Generation Forum at AACII, spoke at Innovation Day Erlangen on 25 September 2025. Diana Al Jabour, head of the satellite project in Jordan, reported

on the New Generation Forum. The Technical University of Würzburg Schweinfurt (THWS) is linked to the German Jordan University Amman. Mr Karl Jantsch explained this special position among universities with Ala Awali from Jordan. This has now earned a global award.



The VDI Association of German Engineers promotes young talent with a wealth of potential, which attracted

great interest through the speech given by the coordinator, Mr Matthias Gundermann.

Uli Herwanger is an AACII award winner because he motivates students to do their best at the Willstätter Research Centre. This

has produced many award winners, including the exhibitors at the AACII who won first prize in Jugend forscht Deutschland. Prominent personalities from Fürth include Henry Kissinger and Ludwig Erhard.





The Wilhelm Löhe University was named after the famous Fürth native, according to President Clemens Werkmeister.

All eyes were on the FAU Friedrich Alexander University airship at the congress. Niklas Heidenreich explained the scientific feat behind it.



Lorena Nicotera from the Max Planck Institute in Cologne spoke about exciting developments for space.

Boston's Harvard University is known for being very selective and accepted only one German student into its summer programme last year: Sanyukt Mishra with his project. He comes from the AACII Astrokids circle. The video message from AACII Astrokid correspondent Alex Hugo Sobczek from Brazil came to us from the Space Museum there.


